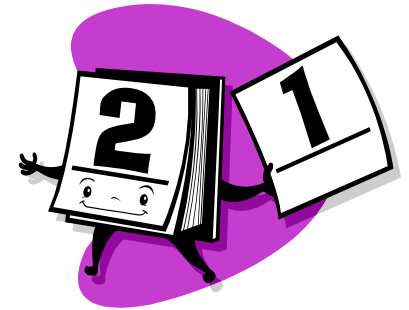

Historians Report - May 2012

Remembering 1978:

Proposition 13 was approved in California slashing property taxes by nearly 60%. Average income per year was \$17,000 and one gallon of gas cost \$0.63. The BAWWA Treasurer's Report from September 1978 noted that the November general meeting was planned for the Holiday Inn at a cost of \$8.00 for members and \$9.00 for non-members. Year-end BAWWA membership stood at 259, and the bank account showed a balance of \$1,336. Minutes also note that the August Golf Tournament was a big success "although the shot-gun start was difficult to handle". 160 people attended the bar-b-que.

[Aquarium of the Bay ~ Behind the Scenes Tour ~ Post Event Report](#)

On February 16, 2012, BAWWA hosted a Behind the Scenes (BTS) Tour at the Aquarium of the Bay in San Francisco (the Aquarium) before our quarterly general meeting. Tour spots were limited (only 40) and not everyone who expressed interest was able to attend, so this article attempts to summarize the BTS Tour experience. Behind the Scenes: Aquarium Facilities and Operations

The Aquarium has two large primary exhibit tanks, and a number of smaller satellite tanks, such as the [touch tanks](#) that allow visitors to touch sharks, rays, skates, and a variety of invertebrates. Many additional satellite tanks are behind the scenes (only accessible on the BTS tour), such as the quarantine area, nursery area, and a “vacation” tank (the touch tank animals cycle between the visitor touch tanks and the vacation tank, spending about 1 month in each environment). The main system circulates water through the two primary tanks, while the satellite tanks remain separate.

Facilities and Operations – Vital Statistics

- Intake pump capacity = 200 gpm
- Intake pump operation ~ twice/day up to 10 hours/day
- Total system volume ~ 1 million gallons
- Main system (2 primary tanks)
 - Volume = 742,000 gallons
 - Flow rate into each primary tank = 2,700 gpm
 - Turnover Rate ~ 2 hours, 20 minutes
 - Ozonation: 350 gpm, 2 minute dwell time
Ozone generation ~ 7 pounds/day
 - Fractionation: 150 gpm, 2 minute dwell time
Removes organics down to 0.1 microns



Foam Fractionators

The Aquarium obtains its water from the San Francisco Bay, using a submersible pump off the end of Pier 39 at a depth of about 20 feet. The Aquarium prefers high salinity, low turbidity, and relatively high pH Bay water (to better match ocean conditions), modifying their pumping operations tidally and seasonally, such that they typically pump twice daily for up to 10 hours a day. The system utilizes direct filtration with biologically active sand filters, where aerobic bacteria convert ammonia to nitrite to nitrate. Denitrification is handled within anaerobic pockets in the substrate of the main tanks. Although it is difficult to determine the nitrate removal efficiency for this method, nitrate levels are generally less than 20 ppm.

Disinfection and organics removal is conducted on a side loop of the main system with ozonation and protein skimmers, or foam fractionators, a process that is usually limited to seawater systems because freshwater does not foam. Since ozone can be dangerous to marine creatures, burning the gills of fish and the tissues of invertebrates, any ozone left over from the contact chambers is stripped out of the water in two

biological degas towers. The satellite tanks utilize UV disinfection instead of ozonation.

To ensure the health of the Aquarium, staff monitor pH, temperature, conductivity, dissolved oxygen, turbidity, ammonia, nitrite, nitrate, bromide, phosphate, calcium, and oxidation-reduction potential. Some parameters are monitored continuously, while others are sampled at least twice a week.

In its current configuration, the Aquarium could operate for about 3 days without diverting from the Bay. Anything longer than 3 days, and the Aquarium would work with neighboring institutions that have the capability to produce artificial seawater.



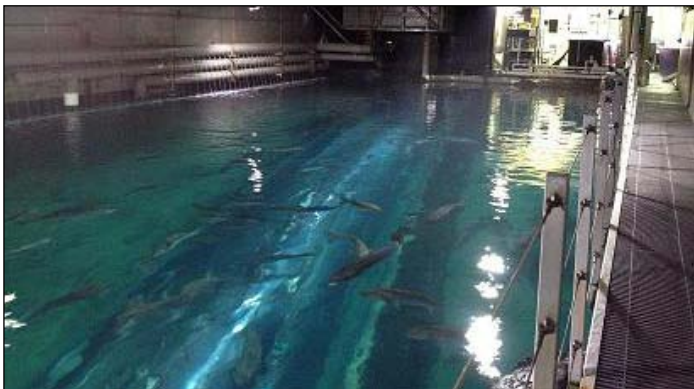

The Stars: Aquarium Animals

The Aquarium captures the beauty of the San Francisco Bay in three main exhibit areas:

- “[Discover the Bay](#)” provides an introduction and features over a thousand aquatic animals that make their homes in the Bay.
- “[Under the Bay](#)” gives visitors a divers perspective of [jelly fish](#) and provides a unique experience with tunnels to walk under/within the two primary tanks: a near shore environment with swirling schools of Anchovies, giant Sea Bass, colorful Sea Stars, and Giant Pacific Octopuses; and a deep water environment with all five local [shark](#) species as well as rays and [sturgeon](#).
- “[Touch the Bay](#)” features touch pools with sharks and rays, as well as one with sea stars and other invertebrates; an exhibit highlighting the Bay estuary; an interactive Bay Lab station; and exhibits highlighting land-dwelling animals as well.

The BTS Tour took participants above the “Under the Bay” tanks and into private areas of the Aquarium where BAWWA learned about the maintenance of the facilities and the care of the animals.

Many of the animals on exhibit are born within the aquarium, including moon jellies, rays, skates, and angel sharks. The Aquarium has the first ever Pacific angel shark born in captivity! Baby bat rays are born alive, but are easy prey for other animals; therefore, staff closely monitor the tank and remove baby rays as soon as possible, moving them to the nursery, where they will stay for about 1 year before going on display in the touch tanks for about another year, then to the primary exhibit tanks as they mature.

When BAWWA visited, the Aquarium had three adult [Giant Pacific Octopuses](#) (GPO), the largest octopus species in the world but so reclusive it's almost never seen. The GPO at the Aquarium were found in [crab traps](#), where they had no doubt been looking for fresh Dungeness. Recently, the Aquarium rescued a juvenile octopus, weighing only 10-15 pounds, visit the Aquarium to watch this new addition grow-up!

The BTS tour was guided by Aquarium Naturalists who provided a unique perspective on the Aquarium’s 20,000 animals. Details on the facilities and operations were provided by Matthew Jensen, Manager of Life Support Systems and Facilities.

- Participants are required to wear construction or hiking boots. No street shoes or athletic shoes will be allowed on the tour.



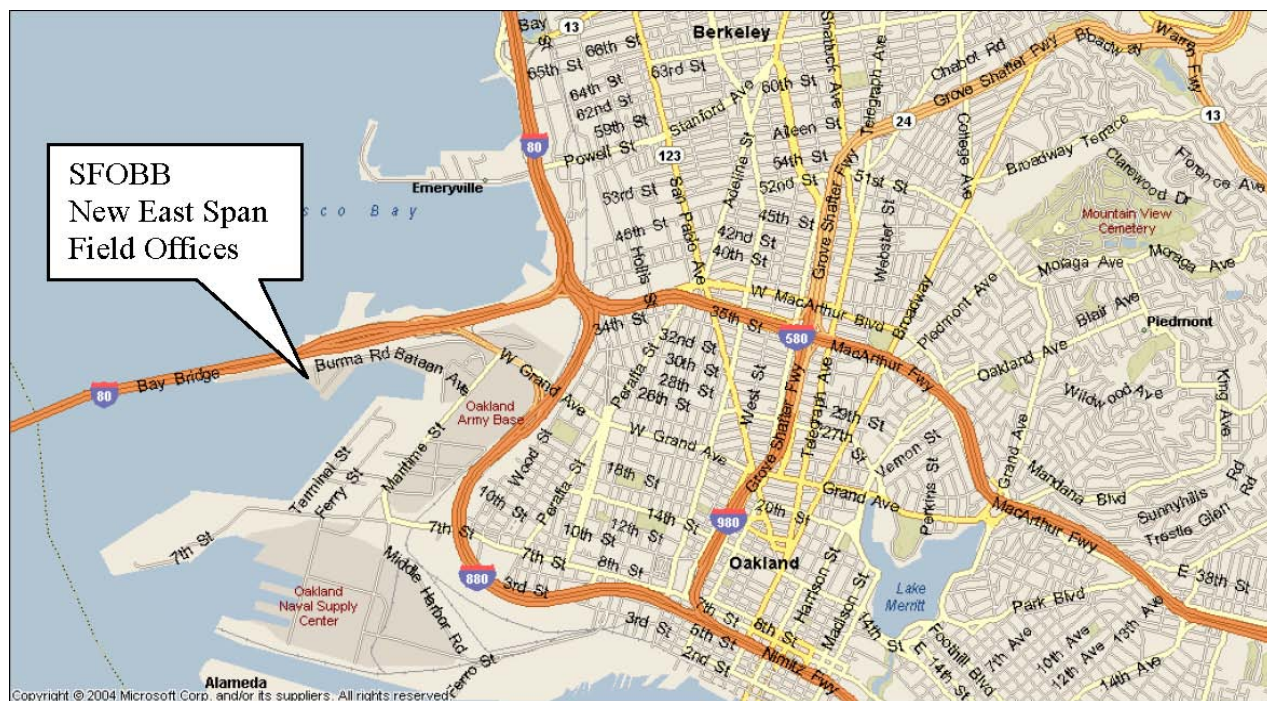

From Sacramento (Westbound I-80)

1. Drive westbound I-80 to Emeryville
2. Stay in the 3rd lane from the left through Emeryville
3. Take the I-880 Alameda/San Jose connector
4. Take the West Grand Avenue/7th Street Exit
5. Turn right onto Grand Avenue
6. Turn left onto Maritime Street
7. Turn right onto Burma Road
8. Continue to the end of Burma Road
9. Pass through the open gate and guard station to the field office

From San Francisco (Eastbound I-80)

1. Drive westbound on I-80 to Oakland
2. Take the southbound I-880 connector
3. Take the West Grand Avenue/Maritime Street exit

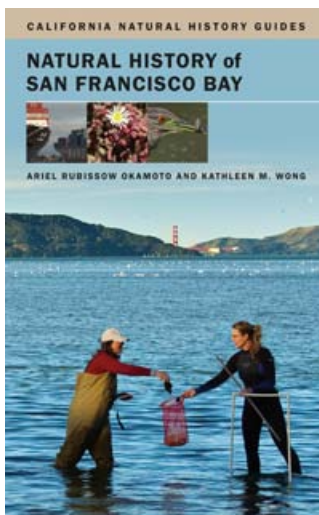

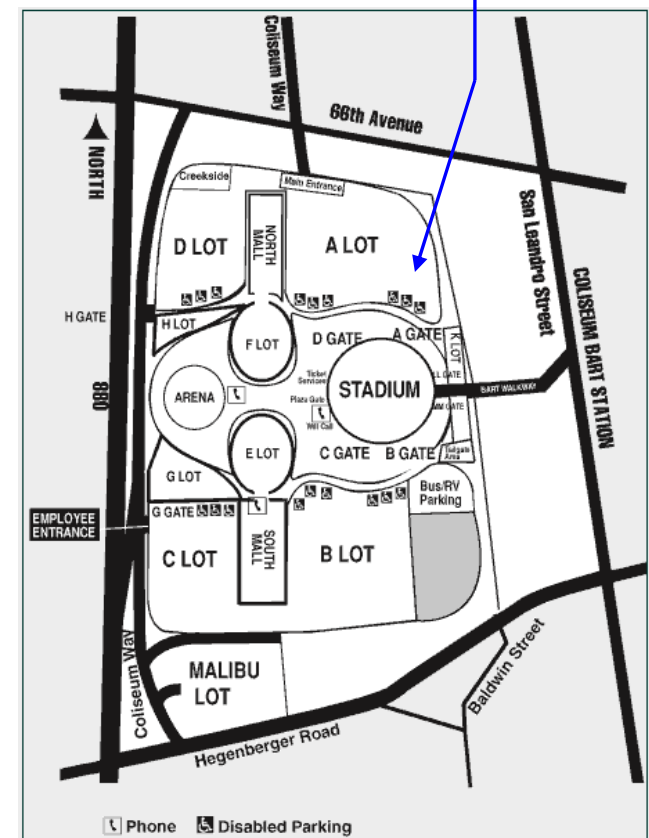

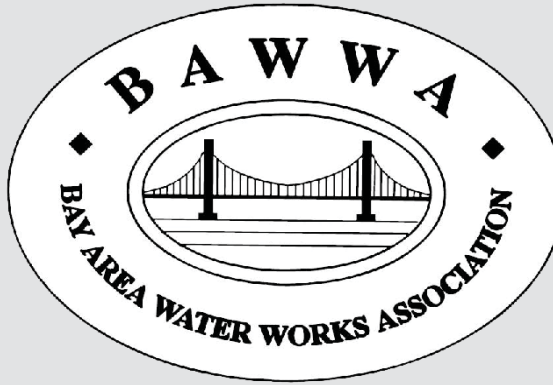
